

Indian National Movement Timeline (1885-1947)

→ The early phase

- 1885 - Establishment of the Indian National Congress
- 1905 - Partition of Bengal
- 1906 - Formation of the Muslim League
- 1907 - Great split (Division of Congress into moderates and extremists)
- 1908 - Execution of Khudiram Bose
- 1909 - Morley-Minto Reforms Act

→ The Middle Phase

- 1913 → Ghadar Movement
- 1914 → Beginning of world war I
- 1915 → Mahatma Gandhi's return to India from South Africa
- 1916 → Lucknow Pact (Agreement between Congress and Muslim League)
- 1917 → Champaran Satyagraha (Gandhi's first active involvement)
- 1918 → Kheda Satyagraha, Ahmedabad Mill strike
- 1919 → Jallianwala Bagh Massacre / Rowlatt Act
- 1920 → Start of the Non-Cooperation Movement
- 1922 → Chauri Chaura incident (leading to the end of non-cooperation)
- 1923 → Formation of the Swaraj Party
- 1924 → Belgaum session (the only INC session presided over by Gandhi)
